I RELATORI

Denis M Bourgeois



Prof. Bourgeois qualified as a Dental Surgeon (BDS) from the University of Lyons, France, in 1981 and practised as a General Dental Practitioner from 1981 to 1995. He holds a Master in Epidemiology (MPH) from the same university (1986), a PhD in Health Economics (1987), in Public Health (1990) and a postgraduate degree in Periodontology (1984) and in Statistics (1983). Prof. Bourgeois worked for the World Health Organization Headquarter Office (WHO/HQ) as a short-term consultant and short-term professional on Oral Health from 1988. His activities focus mainly on oral health surveillance and health politics applied to developing countries. As leader or coordinator of international, regional or national research and development projects, he has collaborated with major international institutions, with various ministries and with a great many national dental associations, foundations, NGOs, etc. He has contributed to the integrated development of oral health programme activities particularly in developing countries, according to FDI policies of prevention and health promotion. He has been actively involved in the development of health promotion and oral health surveillance systems based on the analysis of systematic data on oral health status and risk factors/behaviours, including tobacco use and other common risk factors to health. He has given strong support to actions for the improvement of oral and general health in disadvantaged populations, especially by mobilising fundraising resources to support the development of oral health programmes. Prof. Bourgeois is actively participating in the setting-up and development of a health promotion network, a project which involves the European ministries of health, many universities and national dental associations, and the close collaboration of partner developing countries. He has published 48 papers in international publications, 10 WHO reports, has given many conferences as guest speaker, and has co-edited two books. He is in charge of the projects supported by the European Commission Health and Consumer Protection Directorate-General entitled "European Global Oral health Indicators Development Project (EGOHID), Phase I (2002-2004) and phase II (2005-2007)". At the University of Lyons School of Dental Medicine in France, where he was vice-dean, Prof. Bourgeois headed the WHO collaborating centre for Research on Health systems and Education in Oral health from 1993 until 1998. He is currently Professor and Chair of the Department of Public Health and director of the Master in Health Systems Sciences in the speciality areas of "Public oral health" and "International health policies". He is also clinical Professor in Periodontology at the Teaching Hospital. Prof. Bourgeois is a member of the French dental association International affairs committee and was elected President of the "Groupement des Associations Dentaires Francophones" (GADEF – the federation of French speaking dental associations) in Montreal in 2005. He is elected member of the FDI World Dental Development and Health Promotion Committee.

Gail VA Topping



Dr Topping studied dentistry at Dundee Dental School between 1987 and 1994, taking a year out to study Medical Psychology for an intercalated Bachelor of Medical Science degree in 1990/91, investigating the influence of clinical experience on the ability of dental students to accurately assess anxiety in patients. Soon after graduating from dental school she went on to undertake a four year Medical Research Council Training Fellowship in Health Services Research at DHSRU, completing a distance learning certificate course on health economics with the University of Aberdeen, the Master of Public Health degree and PhD studies on the misdiagnosis of caries in restored teeth. In 1999, an interest in epidemiology took her to Tristan da Cunha, the most remote inhabited island in the world, to lead a small research team conducting a survey of oral and dental health. In the following four years she completed specialist training in Dental Public Health within the National Health Service and worked as locum consultant in Forth Valley and Lothian and Borders NHS Boards before returning to academia in March 2004 to take up a post at DHSRU. Current Projects: National Dental Inspection Programme (NDIP): Gail's main activities in this programme include taking a lead role in the annual training and calibration of dental examiners, overseeing the quality assurance of data collected across Scotland and co-authoring national and local reports on the dental health of school-children. International Caries Detection and Assessment System (ICDAS): As a member of the co-ordinating committee since its first meeting in April 2002 Gail has been involved in the development of a new international standard for the detection and assessment of dental caries. The John Clarkson Fellowship award from the IADR in 2003 allowed her to make field visits to a number of the collaborating centres across the USA and Europe and to take responsibility for co-ordinating the group's efforts.
